Dear Parents / Carers,

### **Full day strike action by teachers on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April**

I am writing to you about forthcoming strike action by the teaching unions in Northern Ireland. You may have seen coverage of this in the news, and I wanted to inform you about the impact this is likely to have at our school and give you sufficient time to make alternative arrangements.

**Please be advised that this guidance may be subject to change at any time.**

### **How will strike action affect Victoria Primary School, Nursery Unit and Learning Support Classroom?**

When a strike takes place, those taking strike action stop work and withdraw their labour. Teachers involved in the action will, therefore, not teach their class(es) or undertake any other duties on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

A detailed risk assessment has been conducted which considers the impact that the action will have on the health and safety of pupils, staff and visitors, and whether the school can run a full or amended curriculum, to determine whether it is possible to operate the school safely during the strike.

As the Principal, I and the Board of Governors have determined the school will be:

### **closed to ALL pupils on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2023**

In terms of school attendance marks, your child's attendance percentage will not be negatively impacted by the school closure on the day of the strike.

Clearly this is a difficult situation, which will cause some disruption. I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A strike by teachers is unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the period that they are on strike.
