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Afterschool Clubs

The majority of our afterschool clubs will begin on the week beginning **MONDAY 1st OCTOBER**. A few clubs will begin earlier and any children that this will impact will bring a letter home soon – if not already!

Last year, we increased the number of clubs we provide across the school substantially – every member of our teaching staff takes 1, if not 2, afterschool clubs. Our school hall is occupied every afternoon to accommodate a sporting club. I am delighted that we are able to offer such a wide range of clubs for our almost 400 children.

I am aware, however, that the clubs we provide may not always be of interest to all of our children. Of course we will do our best to provide clubs that our children want to attend, and I believe that we do very well at this.

In terms of staffing, we are at maximum capacity in terms of the number of clubs we can provide via our own staff. A few parents commented on the end of year parent questionnaire that we did not provide enough clubs for their children.

As I have already mentioned, we have no more capacity in terms of in school staff to increase the number of clubs we offer. That doesn't mean we will give up! If you, as a parent or carer, would like to offer your services and run an additional afterschool club we, as a school, will take you up on your offer.

We will offer you full child protection training and complete an AccessNI check (police check) for you. If you would be interested in running an afterschool club, please call school and have a quick chat with me at some point this week. I hope to get letters out to parents listing all our afterschool clubs at some point next week.
