This group of young people have met with Mr Fulton twice this year to discuss their vision for the future and their role within Victoria Primary School and Nursery Unit.

Victoria Primary School's 'THIS IS ME' day.

On **FRIDAY 18th JANUARY 2019**, the Anti Bullying Ambassadors (ABAs for short) have organised our very own 'This Is Me' day. On this day, the ABAs want to promote that it is OK to be yourself, to be an individual, to be unique – that it is perfectly fine to say '**THIS IS ME!'**.

So.....on Friday 18th January, children are invited to come to school in any way that shows off what makes them, them! For example, if a child is a keen footballer they may wish to wear a football kit and bring in some awards they have won, or we may have some children interested in horse riding and they may wish to wear, or bring in, some of their horse riding attire. Coming into school wearing a particular outfit is not compulsory, children may just bring in something to show, or have a particular story to tell. School Uniform Reminder	Use of the School Car Park

Earrings should not be worn to school – if ears have been recently pierced earrings need to be covered with a plaster. No nail varnish etc to be worn to school. Plain white t-shirt (or school t-shirt) and black shorts to be worn for PE. 	Can I remind parents and carers that the school car park is for the use of school staff and school visitors only. Parents that require disabled access may also use the car park once consent from the Principal has been sought. Consent Forms – URGENT
